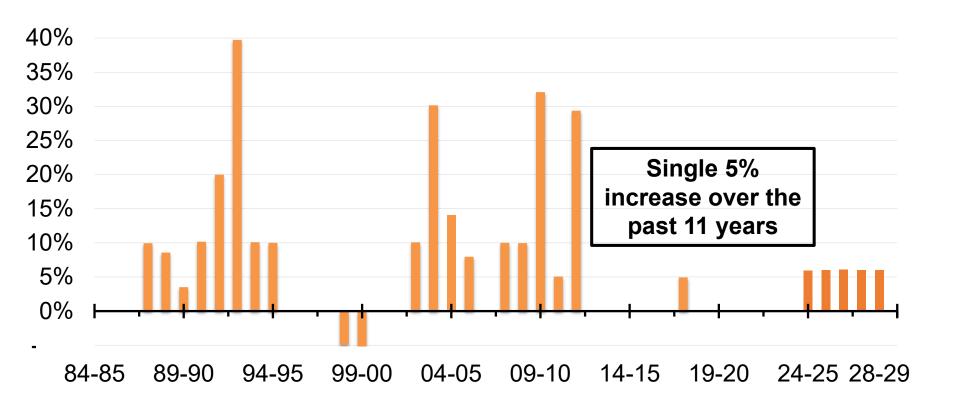

#### **Governor's Compact**

- The Governor proposed annual, year-over-year ongoing General Fund base increases of five percent for the term of the compact from 2022-23 through 2026-27 fiscal years.
- In addition to annual base increases, the 2022-23 Governor's Budget provides a 1 percent increase in resident undergraduate enrollment; 9,434 additional full-time equivalent <u>CSU</u> students, compared to a 2021-22 baseline.

#### Reasons for a Multi-Year Tuition Increase

- Ensure all students have opportunities to earn lifelong, lifetransforming benefits of a CSU degree
- State funding decline over the decades
- Limited state support on the horizon
- Funding gap identified by Sustainable Financial Model Workgroup
- Improves financial sustainability & predictability

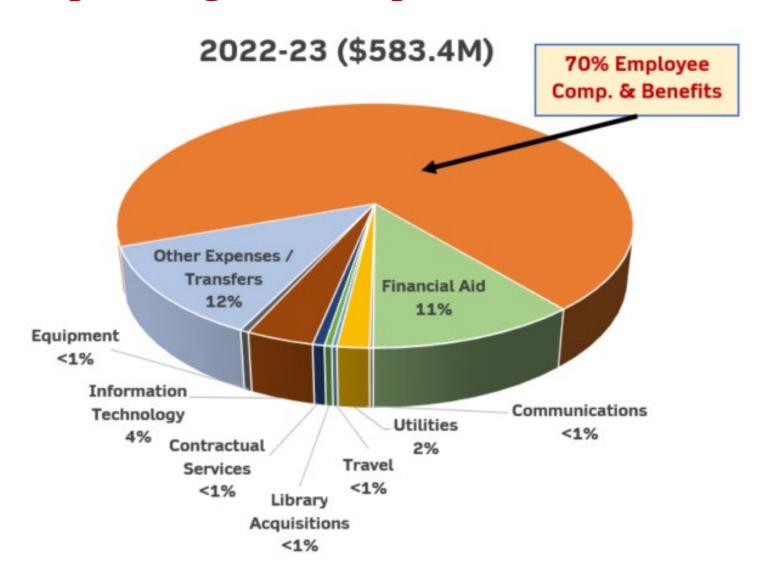

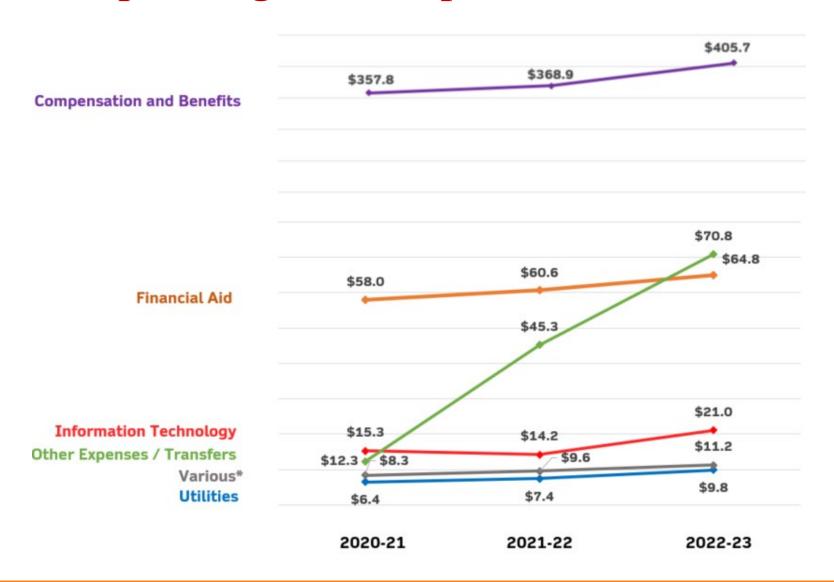

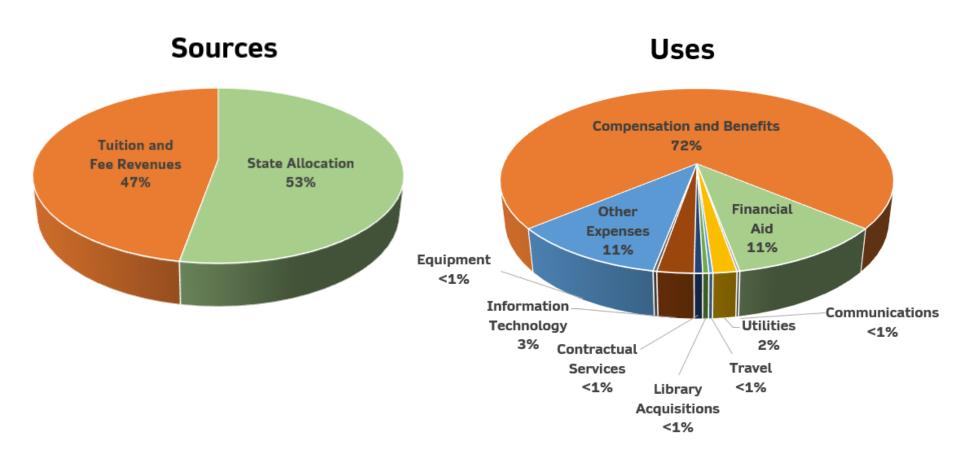
