### IV. New Business

- 4.1 Budget memo update President García and Danny Kim
- President García presented the State of the University and update since Convocation in August 2014. Topics covered in presentation included:
  - o Thank you to PRBC members for continued efforts
  - CSUF is second largest campus as of Fall 2014, CSUN is the largest in the CSU • Gain in graduation rates from 51.1% to 55.7% for a 4.6% increase
  - o Improvement of undergrad transfer rates from 72% to 75.4% for a 3.4% increase
  - o Working to close the achieve gap for diversified students Strategic Plan
  - October 27<sup>th</sup> Town Hall "Culture of doing", Task Force reports on website beginning November 24<sup>th</sup>

- White House identified CSUF Strategic Plan as an emerging model/template focusing on building sustainable partnerships to support the university in addressing low income first-time freshmen (underserved)
- $\circ$  Faculty searches Dean of COTA and Dean of Communications , 150 faculty positions in two years
- Strategic Plan Recruit/Retain high qualified faculty and staff mirrors the diversity student population
  - 62 new faculty and 50 new staff
- $\circ$  Philanthropic Foundation September Board Meeting appointed 7 new board members
- $\circ$  Concert Under the Stars Fundraising goal efforts doubled over prior year \$570,000
- $\circ$  HRDI honored by the College and University Professional Association for Human Resources with a monetary award of \$6,000
- o Fall Climate Survey Evaluation Team shared Diversity Action Plan
- Meeting with all colleges 4 completed thus far with additional meetings in Spring 2015
- o Athletics
  - Men's and Women's Soccer Teams won the Big West Championships but Men's team lost in the NCAA conference in double overtime
  - Baseball team made playoffs for the 23<sup>rd</sup> time
  - Golf Team participated in Invitational Tournaments
- CSU Student Success Working Group addressing campus-wide Student Fee Advisory on SSI fees
- CSU Budget \$142 million allocated for FY 2014-2015, \$95 million less than the BOT requested from Governor to support enrollment growth, student success, invest in high impact practices, and improve/maintain academic programs
- Funds to address campus priorities: Invest in campus resources and infrastructure, delivery of service to help students, address structural deficits, and align goals as the campus implements the strategic plan
- President asked Provost Cruz and VP Kim to review the budget with a zero enrollment growth scenario
- CSU work group (CSUF not represented) identified to review the current financial model on FTES funding. CSUF ranks the lowest among the CSU as President advocates to narrow the gap during discussions with CSU CFO Relyea
- President offered her support and thanked members for their work on the Funding Equity Resolution document
- Vice President Kim presented the FY 2014-15 Fiscal State of the University. Topics from the powerpoint overview covered:
  - o FY 2014-15 Baseline Budget Summary
    - CSU \$142 million general fund increase
    - CSUF \$4.2 million from tuition fees for a total baseline of \$19.3 million
  - FY 2014 Budget Summary \$38 million, spend down (one-time) reserves to address campus priorities

- FY 2014-15 Commitments mandated costs, over-enrollment penalty of \$1 million, requires additional institutional support for classes
- o Operationalization of the University's Strategic Plan implement tasks
- o Reinvesting in Instructional & Support Infrastructure maintenance
- o Core Operations to Support Student Success Cal Teach, EDD
- o Strategically Address Divisional Structural Deficits -
  - Develop Position Management System to track positions and funding
- o Additional Investment via Re-Allocation of Existing Resources online
- recruitment platform to replace BrassRing, Academic Master Plan
- o Student Success Initiative Funding
- 0 % Allocation by Division
- 0% Allocation by Division Net University-wide
- o Beyond 2014-15
  - Revenue source from enrollment growth
  - Space, facilities, repairs and maintenance bonds
  - Deferred maintenance
  - Prop 30 taxes and future impact, economy
- $\circ$  Funding per FTE CSUF at the bottom of the chart
- o Campus Mandatory Student Fees category 2 fees
- o Additional discussions involved:
